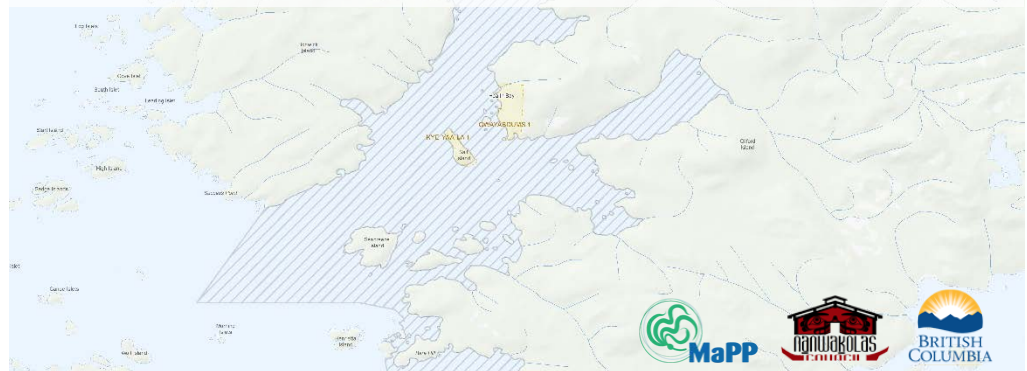
### Free Resource

#### B.C. Imagery Web Map Services (WMS)

DataBC offers a wide range of aerial and satellite acquired imagery as non-queryable WMS layers. Imagery, orthophoto mosaics, satellite imagery, and hillshade relief are all available at various pixel sizes (resolution), ranging from 30m to half a metre. ### Recent Project Updates

In March 2016, Inlailawatash undertook a cultural heritage assessment of eight Marine Protection Zones for Nanwakolas Council and the Province of British Columbia as part of their collaboration on the **North Vancouver Island Marine Plan**. In order to create a comprehensive inventory of known and potential sites in the area, we developed an archaeological potential model based on archival research, ethnographic place names, and known relationships between geophysical data and site locations.



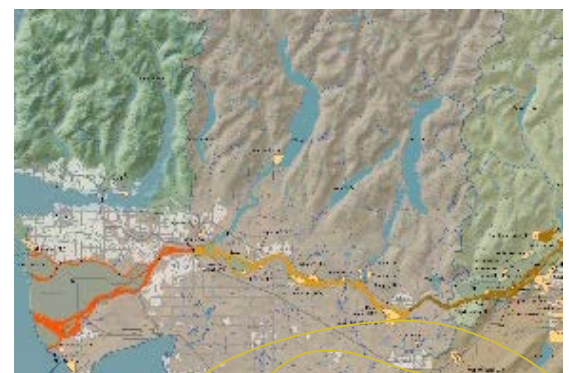
### 2016 Indigenous Mapping Workshop
